

## WHAT MAKES A GOOD PERSON DO EVIL THINGS?

When *Address Unknown* was first published as a novella in 1938, the New York Times called it 'the most effective indictment of Nazism to appear in fiction.' Set in 1932, *Address Unknown* chronicles the friendship between two business partners in a successful San Francisco gallery. Martin Schulse, a German-born Aryan, has returned to Germany with his wife and children and re-established ties to his homeland becoming active with the National Socialists; Max Eisenstein, a German Jew, has remained to run the gallery in San Francisco.

Letters between the two men reveal the ideological divide between the former friends/partners and the truth about Germany's new order. Under the influence of Nazism, Schulse commits a cowardly act of betrayal, and his former friend exacts an ingenious and deadly revenge.
