We just completed our very successful major functions, with around 1000 people attending our Major Donors, Main Event and Young MDA functions. Thank you to everyone who attended; your generous donations enable us to continue our work supplying funding to Magen David Adom in Israel, including purchasing emergency response vehicles, Israel's Blood Bank, and now Israel's Mothers Milk Bank. Your donations continue to save lives 24/7 throughout Israel.

Our entertainer, Elon Gold an internationally acclaimed stand-up comedian, was enthusiastically received at each event.

A special thank you to our Corporate Sponsors whose names appear on our website www.magendavidadom.org.au, as well as in this newsletter. I encourage you to support our Corporate Sponsors.

I also want to thank everyone who made these functions run smoothly, including our CEO Doron Lazarus, Tamara Lowbeer, Rivkah Lazarus and special help from Tammy Zlattner. From our Board, whilst everyone helped tirelessly, I want to particularly thank Melissa McCurdie, Josh Bolot and Allyson Small, and our MDA Israel liaison, Ido Golan Gutin who recreated an MDA dispatch centre showing the response time between when a call for help comes in, and when an emergency vehicle arrives. Many people took the opportunity to have a photo on our MDA Medicycle, which will be used for MDA's promotional and educational purposes.

During the four year Presidency of my esteemed predecessor, Rolly Nagel, MDA made significant strides, growing from a small organization, to a much larger one with much larger donations enabling us to buy more vehicles and make more of a contribution to MDA in Israel. One of the standouts was to achieve Deductible Gift Recipient status, meaning all donations over \$2 are tax deductible.

We are honoured that we have been able to send funds to Israel which have been used to purchase life support ambulances, 4WD ambulances, a bulletproof ambulance, mobile intensive care ambulances, a mini electric fast response vehicle, medicycles, intercity paramedic motorcycle, e-bikes, an ambulance driver training simulator system together with MDA France, as well as defibrillators, respirators, blood filters, advanced monitors, and numerous other urgently needed medical equipment. Without doubt. these have saved thousands of Israeli lives, as well as reducing their pain, suffering and trauma.

This year, in addition to the funds we have raised for the abovementioned emergency vehicles and medical equipment, we are also very proud to be the sole funder of Israel's first Mothers Milk Bank. Our special guest at our events was Dr Sharron Bransburg-Zabary, the Director of the Milk Bank who explained the rationale behind creating this vital lifesaving service for seriously ill babies.

We have been honoured to have received several sizeable estates from members of our community. Recently, the Estate of the Late John Davis enabled us to present Magen David Adom in Israel with a Mobile Intensive Care Unit ambulance (MICU). These ambulances have specialized lifesaving equipment which can make the difference between life and death.

Jonathon Green's observations of stellar service

Driving at high speed around Tel Aviv in an ambulance is an experience Melissa and I will never forget.

When I joined the Board of Australian Friends of Magen David Adom last year I was keen to support a wonderful Israeli service with a stellar reputation for saving lives and caring for anyone who needs emergency medical attention. Seeing it together for ourselves was truly enlightening.

On our shift was a Muslim Israeli driver who is a medic and took primary care of patients when we arrived on the scene. A great guy who has five languages and a terrific sense of humour, especially about the occasional intolerant patient who was not too keen on being helped by an Arab! He laughs it off and gets on with his vital job of saving lives.

He was supported by two strong, capable young Jewish women (16 and 17 years old) who have done 4 months training and who volunteer their service. They were professional, smart and focussed belying their years. Yet they still giggled like school girls, checking their phones when they had a moment of rest after patients were safely dropped at hospital.

We saw 8 or 9 cases (thankfully nothing too gruesome) on our shift and they were all handled with intimate care and dedication by the entire crew.

This was unforgettable and truly made me proud to be a supporter and a Board Member of Australian Friends of Magen David Adom.

Experiences of the Overseas Volunteers Program

In May this year I completed the First Aid Course for young overseas volunteers which I can recommend for anyone willing to put themselves out of their comfort zone!

I came to Israel not knowing anyone, the language or the culture. As a pro-Israel Christian I found it fascinating learning about the Jewish faith and its many traditions.

For ten days we lived with other international course members learning from 8:30am until 8:30pm, so we really got to know one another.

The course was extremely informative, teaching us a variety of first aid techniques from basic life-support through to preparing us to treat patients in mass casualty situations. At the end of the ten day training, I qualified as a first aid responder with loads of new friends, an ideal way to begin the five week volunteering period! On shift, as volunteers, we became the thirdresponder on the ambulance attending all calls no matter what ethnic background or religion. There was always the possibility of life-threatening situations but we were thankful that was not often the case. We routinely checked the vital signs of our patients and in more serious cases cleaning and bandaging wounds was also done. I will never forget performing CPR on two elderly patients resuscitating one, but unfortunately the other passed away. It was encouraging to know, that after such an incident, there was always someone to talk to if I was troubled. Such help was not only available from the crew members, but also from the strong MDA support network from the program.

Reflecting on the course, it certainly did prepare us for the majority of experiences we would encounter. I really recommend this volunteer experience to any young person -

everyone is always made to feel welcome. If you are motivated you will get a huge amount out of the experience. You are given total independence in organising your shifts and travelling from your accommodation to the MDA station. No matter what the situation, there is always something you can do if you are proactive and take the initiative!



A Remarkable Life – John Davis 1906-2008

John Geoorge Davis was born in Sydney on August 7, 1906. His early life was spent in Mosman where he was educated at Mosman Public School.

His father was a wholesale merchant and at 14 John joined the business to earn 10/- (\$1) a week from which he had to pay fares to work and had to obey his father's order to make a monthly donation of 2/- (20c) to help those in need, which he told friends "was my first introduction to charity".

He quit working for his father after three years, but his life was upset when his mother passed away that year. When his father remarried, John left home, surviving by selling vacuum cleaners door-to-door.

It was at this time in his early life that he decided to start his own business going from shop to shop, buying as many small items as he could and reselling them at 'wholesale prices'.

Come 1939 and with it World War II, John received his call-up papers during 1941. Soon after, he met and married Queenie, whose given name was Viva Slutzkin.

In 1942 when the US Army took over the Grace Buildings where he had his small but flourishing business, John purchased a duplex at Bondi. It was the start of his property 'empire'.

Soon after, he purchased land in Blacktown on which he built 12 shops, one of which was to be the delicatessen owned by Frank Lowy and John Saunders, the founders of the Westfield Shopping Centres. Over the years John Davis would tell how he advised Lowy and Saunders about property before they started Westfield Holdings.

John then purchased land in Caringbah and built 27 shops. In 1946 he acquired land at Potts point for a nine-storey building, part of which was to provide a home for him and Queenie for many decades.

With no children of their own, John and Queenie sponsored a young Survivor of the Nazi Holocaust, Leon Wise.

At 83 years of age he decided to retire from the wholesale business but continued his property investments.

John and his wife Viva were long-time members of the Great Synagogue. He was an office bearer at the Lodge Mark Owen at Double Bay and a much loved-member of the Double Bay Bowling Club.

After 62 years of marriage, Queenie died following more than two years of illness. Soon after, John went on holiday to Cairns, finding it a lovely town and ideal for property investments, including a winter home for himself on the Esplanade, where he peacefully passed away on January 14, 2008.

MDA Launches First Aid Training for Youth

Many people know Magen David Adom for the lifesaving services they provide in Israel but closer to home, in Australia, we face situations where family, friends and colleagues experience an accident or serious medical emergency. Would you know what to do in that situation?

Magen David Adom understands just how important the right knowledge



and training is when responding to any medical situation, no matter how minor or serious. To meet this need, MDA has launched its Medical Response, Safety and First Aid Training programs designed for school students aged between 12-16. The courses can cover the very basics – choking, fractures, bites or certified CPR training.

CEO of MDA in NSW, Doron Lazarus commented, "Each and every day MDA saves lives. We are committed to ensuring that we not only provide funding for vital emergency services in Israel but that we contribute to the welfare of our local community. It could make all the difference."

A number of courses have already been conducted with great success. Vivienne Radomsky, Project Manager B'nai B'rith NSW who organized a group ranging in ages from 10-15 said, "it was fantastic, the children were really engaged and loved it. The trainer was on top of things, he kept them busy and occupied the whole time."
